### Dear Volunteers,

This week's newsletter includes several important updates including news from the RDA UK Board about the governance review.

There is also an update to safeguarding policies, as well as news on the upcoming Volunteer's week event, new drop-in volunteer support sessions, training opportunities, the Virtual National Championships, plans for future Coaching Conferences, and the coaching awards deadline.

## **Governance Review**

The RDA UK Board has commissioned a governance review to take place over the coming months and is committed to involving our members, volunteers, and participants in this process, and which can only be effective with your input. The aim of the review is to ensure that RDA UK continues to operate effectively in achieving our shared mission and that our governance continues to evolve and be updated in line with good practice so that we all meet the expectations of the Charity Commission, OSCR The Scottish Charity Regulator, and the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland. The review will also look at relationships and how we best work together across the federation.

Following a competitive tender process, the specialist charity governance advisors, the <u>Centre for Charity Effectiveness (CCE)</u>, has been commissioned to support RDA UK with this review. The CCE is part of the Bayes Business School, and its consultancy team brings a combination of regulatory and academic rigour together with extensive practical experience of working with charities who have federated structures similar to the RDA.

There will be opportunities for everyone to get involved between now and the autumn and the Board very much encourages everyone's participation. CCE will start by consulting with a representative set of member group volunteers, which will then be followed by a wider consultation process open to all volunteers within the federation, through a series of online

and face-to-face events at which there will be the opportunity to hear from Trustees and our new Chief Executive, as well as plenty of time for comments, questions and discussion.

On a practical note, over the next few days, Regional Chairs will receive an e-mail asking them to put forward representative volunteers from member groups to take part in the first stage of this process.

The Board hopes that many of you will want to participate in the governance review and looks forward to hearing your views over the coming months as we come together to learn from one another and build a stronger organisation.

## **Updated Safeguarding Policies**

In our ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of everyone within our community, we have recently reviewed and updated our safeguarding policies. The update is aimed at strengthening our procedures to better protect individuals within our organisation and providing more clarity for implementing safeguarding practices.

The new policies will consist of:

- 1. Safeguarding Children Policy
- 2. Safeguarding Adults at Risk Policy
- 3. Managing Concerns Policy
- 4. Safer Recruitment Policy

We plan to roll the safeguarding policies out in a gradual phased process.

The <u>initial phase</u> is to introduce the three policies: <u>Safeguarding Children</u>, <u>Safeguarding Adults at Risk</u> and <u>Managing Concerns</u>. We would like to assure you that there is no material change within these policies and no action is required from Groups other than to adopt them as updates to those policies that are currently in place. To reiterate, these policies have been updated to provide more robust practices and clarity in their implementation.

The three policies will be uploaded onto <u>MyRDA Policies</u> and aligned within the <u>Safeguarding Section</u>.

The later phase will involve the roll out of the fourth policy, Safer Recruitment. There is more material change within this policy because of statutory changes and we are developing a detailed phased plan for implementation to support Groups before this is introduced. **You do not need to action anything at this stage**.

**Coaching Conference Update** 

We have been reaching out to the coaching community and would like to thank everybody for their input. In addition, as an optional extra, we plan to host some question-and-answer sessions on the Friday of the National Championship. These will be with paraprofessionals, including one speaker who has been through the coaching pathway, and subsequently become an RDA participant!

Save the date: RDA Virtual National Championships, 15th – 17th November 2024 We are delighted to be able to run the Virtual National Championships again and the schedule is now live on MyRDA and entries close on Sunday 6th October 2024.

This year, working with RDA UK's National Leads and Regional Dressage coordinators, we have made some improvements, so the competition is accessible to more participants.

We have introduced additional grass roots ungraded classes, to encourage more RDA participants of all levels to compete. In addition, all the action and results will be live streamed across three days this year (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday), during the afternoon and early evening, when more people have time to watch.

And we are delighted to be partnering with Dressage Anywhere to run graded classes for our more advanced riders. Dressage Anywhere will run grade 1-5 classes, including the Visually Impaired grades B1, B2, B3, B4, B5, as part of their exciting RDA specific dressage series, where points can be accumulated, culminating in a Dressage Anywhere Championships.
