Dear Volunteers,

This week's newsletter includes additional information on the Governance Review; a round up of Volunteers' week; award nomination opportunities and upcoming training events. We also have an update on Annual Returns and Membership & Insurance Renewals 24/25 and changes to the National Office Team.

Governance Review

In the last newsletter we let you know about the <u>RDA Governance Review</u>, to which our RDA community will be asked to contribute to over the rest of this year. Throughout the review we are committed to involving people from all parts of the federation. Your thoughts, expressed through focus groups during June and road shows and online meetings in the Autumn, will be at the heart of the work done by CCE (<u>our governance experts</u>). We have tried to keep the initial consultation to times in the early evenings and weekends, and we have kept clear of the summer holidays.

One of the first stages is bringing together five different focus groups over the next few weeks. These groups will held online, via Zoom, and last a maximum of 90 minutes. They will be run by CCE, who have lots of experience with governance reviews in similar federations. We have asked all our Regional Chairs to attend one of two focus groups; we have invited all our National Volunteer leads to attend another group; and the last two groups will consist of volunteers from RDA groups of a variety of sizes and run in different ways. No one is expected to be a governance expert, CCE are keen to learn from you all about your life in RDA, whatever type of volunteer you may be. Everyone's thoughts and experiences are equally valuable.

It is hoped that many of you will want to join in with this review over the coming months, and we are looking forward to hearing everyone's views as RDA comes together to learn from one another and build a strong organisation for the years ahead. As a reminder there will be a series of online and face to face events in the early Autumn to which everyone will be

invited. These events will provide an opportunity for you to hear from our new Chief Executive and Trustees.
