## **LEVEL 2**

### **\*Scoring & Penalties**

Competitors are scored for:

- Quality of pace, preparation and approach to Start line and each fence.
- Turnout of horse and rider
- Collective marks will also be awarded for control, effectiveness, suitability and overall performance.

Marks will be given out of 10.

#### **Penalties will be awarded as follows:**

Disobedience = Refusal, circling, crossing of tracks.

- Knockdown = 4 faults
- First disobedience = 4 faults
- Second disobedience = 4 faults
- Third disobedience = elimination
- Error of course = elimination
- Failure to ride through the start and finish = elimination.
- Fall of horse or rider = elimination
- Jumping the wrong course = elimination
- 1 mark will be deducted at any jump where the leader is seen to be giving help.
- The judge will decide to deduct marks if canter is shown outside the shaded area as shown in the Level 2 course plan.
- Marks will also be deducted if the rider is seen to be creating impulsion i.e. kicking or use of the whip to encourage the horse to canter in the shaded area. If the horse is seen to be in canter from its own forwardness when landing after fence 1 and fence 4, this is permitted.
