***Scoring & Penalties**

Competitors are scored for:

- Quality of pace, preparation and approach to Start line and each fence.
- Turnout of horse and rider
- Collective marks will also be awarded for control, effectiveness, suitability and overall performance.

Marks will be given out of 10.

Penalties will be awarded as follows:

Disobedience = Refusal, circling, crossing of tracks.

- First disobedience = 4 faults
- Second disobedience = 4 faults
- Third disobedience = elimination
- Error of course = elimination
- Failure to ride through the start and finish = elimination.
- Fall of horse or rider = elimination
- Jumping the wrong course = elimination

The judge may decide to deduct marks if:

- canter is not maintained on the approach to each jump.
- if trot is shown on more than one occasion.
