TRAINING AID

The basics of feeding and grooming

We need to take very good care of our horses.

Horses need to be **groomed** regularly, to make sure they stay healthy.

Good grooming is very good for horses' skin. Brushing the whole of a horse's body keeps the coat smooth and glossy and removes loose hair, dust and dirt.

Picking out the horse's hooves with a hoof pick removes dirt and keeps the horse's feet clean and comfortable. It's also a great time to check that the horse has not hurt or damaged its feet in any way.

Grooming the mane and tail with a brush removes knots and dirt, and keeps the horse looking neat and tidy

Carriage Driving:

- Demonstrate how to harness up
- Discuss fit of the harness and vehicle
- Be able to drive and put together simple movements required in a driven dressage test
- Demonstrate the considerate driving of a cones course
- Show that you know these parts of a harness: Those in Grade 1 & 2, plus ROSETTE, BELLY BAND, TRACE CAR-RIER, BREECHING STRAP, GIRTH, LOIN STRAP, BACK BAND and BIT USED
- Have a basic knowledge of the parts of the vehicle: TRACE HOOKS, QUICK RELEASES, REIN RAIL, RAMPS.

Horse Care:

- Show that you know these parts of a horse: Those in Grade 1 & 2, plus FROG, WALL OF THE HOOF, SOLE, CREST, FLANK, ELBOW, DOCK, FETLOCK, MUZZLE, LOIN, HOCK
- Show basic knowledge of the needs of a horse: FEEDING, WATERING, GROOMING
- Show that you know these items: HEADCOLLAR, HAYNET, LEAD ROLE, RUG
- Show that you know how to correctly and safely pick up and pick our a horse's hoof.
