

SILVER PROFICIENCY TEST



Candidates must have been Vaulting for at least 3 years and have been assessed for this standard by their Regional Instructor.

Vaulters must take the test at a venue organised by RDA National Office.

VAULTING:

- 1. Mount from canter to basic seat on left rein
- 2. In canter on left rein:
 - Forward Press Up
 - Forward Scissors
 - Stand
 - Arabesque foot in stirrup
 - Onto neck facing tail
 - Flair leg only on the neck
 - Backwards Princes Kneel
 - Backward Press Up
 - Backwards Swing
- 3. In canter right rein:
 - Basic seat hands on hips
 - Flair leg only
 - Swing
 - Free Kneel
 - Mill
- 4. Work in walk with a pair on the horse

Vaulter must Prop or Fly 5 of the following exercises depending on size of Vaulters

- Double Kneel
- Double Stand
- Back to Back Tailor Seat

- Double Flair
- Double Arabesque
- Stand over Bench
- Sit on Shoulders
- Wheelbarrow
- Flying Angel
- Aeroplane
- 5. Vaulter must show an individual routine with a minimum of 9 moves, none of which are to be Pre Novice or Novice Compulsory exercises
- 6. Dismount of choice to be other than simple everyday one

HORSE CARE:

- Demonstrate or explain how to groom a horse for presentation, to include tail washing.
- Demonstrate or explain how to put on different types of rugs, bandages and boots and explain their uses.
- 3. Demonstrate or explain how to prepare a pony/ horse for travelling in a horse box or trailer.
- 4. Recognise the following bits and explain their fitting and severity:
- RUBBER SNAFFLE, STRAIGHT BAR SNAFFLE, JOINTED SNAFFLE, PELHAM, KIMBLEWICK and FRENCH-LINK.
- 5. Recognise different types of clips and know reasons for clipping.
- 6. Know at least seven of the rules for feeding a pony/horse.
- Recognise four farrier's tools and explain their uses.
- 8. Describe the signs of lameness or illness in a pony/horse.
- 9. Demonstrate under supervision, or explain how to turn a pony/ horse out to grass.
- 10. Know how to tighten a roller girth

PASS MARKS:

Vaulting 85%, Horse Care 70%.

Examinations by RDA approved examiner not working with the Group.

Candidates may take either Vaulting and/or Horse Care and will receive a RDA certificate and badge for each section passed.
